Reparation expectations

You have been made subject to a court order which includes reparation. This means that you will need to complete Community based reparation for as many hours as the Court or the Referral panel has indicated.

Reparation is compulsory. Non-attendance will only be accepted if you are unwell (and can provide evidence) or if there is a family emergency.

A reparation activity will usually last anything between 2-3 hours.

Additional Expectations:

- you will be referred to projects that have been checked in terms of health and safety and are suitable for you
- reparation is part of your court order but we will do our best to make it as enjoyable as it possibly can be
- you will need to sign the consent form and return this to the YOT in advance of the activity
- you must discuss any concerns in relation to the activity in advance. This includes the nature of the activity, the location, the journey route and so forth
- you will arrive on time for your activity. If you are late then you will be unable to take part in the reparation and your YOT officer will be informed. This could result in a formal warning
- you will need to wear appropriate clothing and footwear for the activity e.g. if you are gardening, wear old and waterproof clothes. The YOT will not be liable for any damage to clothing or footwear
- the YOT will provide wellington boots, gloves and high visibility jackets. If you refuse to use them then this will be at your own risk and the YOT will not be liable for any damage caused to you or your clothing
- you should not bring valuable items (watches/jewellery) and any loss or damage cannot be charged to the YOT
- you must have your mobile phone switched off during the activity. You can use it in emergencies only but you will need to inform the reparation supervisor of this. The YOT cannot take responsibility for any loss or damage to mobile phones
- you need to follow the instructions given by the reparation supervisors. Failure to do so could result in your session being terminated and a formal warning being issued
- rude, abusive or aggressive behaviour will result in the session being terminated and you will receive a formal warning
- you can expect to be treated fairly and with respect and in turn you will need to show the same respect to the reparation supervisors and those in and around the activity
- on completion you will get a certificate outlining the hours of reparation you completed and the project (s) you were a part of
- the reparation that you do will not only help towards you completing your court order it will also give something valuable back to the local Community.
